Status:

- B Regular breeding species in Austria: proven breeding or well-founded suspicion thereof in at least eight out of the last ten years¹
- uB Irregular breeding species in Austria: Non-continuous breeding occurrences or well-founded suspicion of breeding in more than three years since 1800 and proven breeding or well-founded suspicion thereof in at least one but not more than seven out of the last ten years¹
- eB Former regular breeding species, now extinct: no proven breeding or well-founded suspicion thereof in the last ten years¹
- euB Former irregular breeding species, now extinct: no proven breeding or well-founded suspicion thereof in the last ten years¹

e(u?)B Extinct breeding occurrence, the regularity of which cannot be judged any more

- aB Exceptional breeder: The species has bred in Austria in not more than three years since 1800, including at least one proven case of breeding (nest, eggs or non-fledged young). aB* denotes species that have bred in Austria so far only in mixed pairs with other species
- D Occurs in Austria regularly on migration
- S Occurs in Austria regularly as non-breeding summer visitor
- W Occurs in Austria regularly as winter guest
- G Non-breeding birds can be found all year (feral waterfowl only)

Category:

- A Recorded in Austria at least once in a wild state since 1. January 1950. There is or was a proof for at least one record (specimen, photograph, video, sound recording etc.).
- A0 No proof (specimen, photograph, video, sound recording etc.) but at least one report since 1950 was accepted by the Austrian Avifaunistic Committee as sufficiently documented.
- B Recorded in a wild state in Austria only between 1800 and 31. December 1949. There is or was a proof for at least one record.
- B0 Recorded in a wild state in Austria only between 1800 and 31. December 1949, but there is or was no proof for these records.
- C Established in Austria as self-sustaining breeding species by man. This includes species that have never been autochthonous to Austria (C₁), species that also occur in Austria in a wild state (C₂), extinct species that have been reintroduced successfully (C₃) and domesticated species that have established self-sustaining feral populations in Austria (C₄).
This category also includes species that occur in Austria as visitors originating from self-sustaining populations in other countries, where they are placed in category C (C₅).
- D This category includes species that cannot be placed safely in another category. These are species for which an origin from captivity cannot be excluded safely for all records (D₁), species for which there are at least occasional breeding records of escaped or released birds, but which cannot yet be considered as self-sustaining (D₂) or species of which a non-autochthonous breeding population in Austria has become extinct (D₃).
Additionally this category includes species for which there are records of birds that originate from only possibly self-sustaining populations in other countries (D₄).
